Commitment to Wildlife and Habitat Conservation

Anheuser-Busch has a long history of supporting conservation of land for the benefit of wildlife. The company strives to protect local and global biodiversity by promoting wildlife habitat conservation and public education. Additionally, the company has fostered long-term partnerships with environmental and wildlife organizations and has directly engaged in animal rescue and endangered species preservation efforts.

WHC Sites

Nine Anheuser-Busch facilities have obtained Wildlife Habitat Council (WHC) “Wildlife at Work” certification for managing company-owned lands for the benefit of wildlife. These facilities are: Elk Mountain Farms in Bonners Ferry, Idaho; Nutri-Turf Farms in Jacksonville, Fla. and Fort Collins, Colo.; Metal Container Corporation can plant in Rome, Ga.; a barley malting plant in Manitowoc, Wis.; a rice mill in Jonesboro, Ark.; and the company’s breweries in Cartersville, Ga.; Fort Collins, Colo. and Merrimack, N.H.

In addition, four of these facilities have achieved Corporate Lands for Learning (CLL) certification. CLL allows students to use corporate property for the study of wildlife and eco-systems. These facilities are: Elk Mountain Farm in Bonners Ferry, Idaho; a rice mill in Jonesboro, Ark.; Cartersville brewery and the company’s operations in Fort Collins, Colo.

WHC was established in 1988 to help corporations manage their land to benefit wildlife.

BEC Efforts

Busch Entertainment Corporation’s (BEC) Adventure Parks support critical conservation research and habitat protection, and assist in conserving species on all seven continents and in the Arctic. BEC has contributed to the non-profit SeaWorld & Busch Gardens Conservation Fund that has funded nearly 300 projects in more than 60 countries since 2003.

Among the many endangered species they work to protect include manatees and sea turtles.

Since 1970, SeaWorld and Busch Gardens have rescued more than 14,000 animals, many injured or ill due to human causes.
